The **Book of Lamentations** (meaning "how?") is a collection of poetic laments (dirges) written to mourn the death of good King Josiah (1 Chron. 35:25) at the **valley of Megiddo.** God had warned Josiah--through the mouth of Pharoah Necho (2 Chron. 35:22) NOT to be involved in the battle between **Egypt & Assyria** vs. **Babylon**. He disguised himself & went to war anyway. In the Hebrew Bible, Lamentations appears in the **Ketuvim** ("Writings") as one of the Five **Megillot** (Scrolls): the Song of Songs, Ruth, Ecclesiastes, and Esther.

ALPHABETIC ACROSTICS

in the The Hebrew Old Testament

Each of the 22 letters of the Hebrew alphabet are in Psalm 119. Most Bibles have these letters listed before each 8 verses that begin with that letter. Hebrew is written right to left. 'Finals' are letters that change their shape (& numerical value) when used at the END of a word.



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AI FPH אשרי תמימידרך ההלכים בתורת יהוה: Blessed are those whose ways are blameless, ALPHABETIC ACROSTICS IN THE PSALMS YHWH TORAH who walk according to Yahweh's law. There are 22 letters in the Hebrew alphabet (a.k.a. aleph-bet). נצרי עדתיו בכללב זרושוהו: Blessed are those who keep his statutes, Psalms 9 & 10 together form a loose alphabetic acrostic (38 verses--often with EDAH who seek him with their whole heart. Psalm I:1 לאפעלו עולה בדרכיו הלכו: Yes, they do nothing wrong. 2 verses beginning with each letter--in alphabetic order). DEREK They walk in his ways. Psalm 25 is an alphabetic acrostic (22 verses, after verse 5, the 'vav' is missing, אתה צויתה פקדיך לשמר מאד: You have commanded your precepts, PIQQUWD after verse 17, the 'goph' is missing-scholars debate the meaning of that). that we should fully obey them. אַחַלִי יְכַּנוּ דְרָכָי לְשָׁמֹר חְקִיף: Oh that my ways were steadfast Psalm 34 is an alphabetic acrostic (22 verses). CHOO to obey your statutes! Psalm 37 is an alphabetic acrostic (40 verses, 2 verses between most letters). אז לאאבוש בהביטי אלכלמצותיף: Then I wouldn't be disappointed, Psalm 111 is an alphabetic acrostic (10 verses) MITSVAH when I consider all of your commandments. I will give thanks to you with uprightness of heart, בישר לבב בלמדי משפטי צדקד: Psalm 112 is an alphabetic acrostic (10 verses) MISHPAT when I learn your righteous judgments. Psalm 119 is an alphabetic acrostic (176 verses, 8 verses for each letter). יזקיך אשמר אלתעזבני עדמאד: I will observe your statutes. Don't utterly forsake me. Psalm 145 is an alphabetic acrostic (21 verses--after verse 13-'nun' is missing).

Here is an example of an alphabetic acrostic in English that is patterned like Psalm 119 with 8 verses for each letter.
