

GARMENTS OF THE PRIESTS (originally Aaron's sons) coat, girdle, bonnet & breeches (Ex. 28:40-42)

"Thou therefore endure hardness, as a good **soldier of Jesus Christ.**" (2 Timothy 2:3) The warriors' garments are not for 'glory & beauty' (Exodus 28:2 & 40) as were the Priests entering into God's Presence. Priests bore **no helmets, swords or shoes** when entering in. They went barefoot: Moses was told: '...put off thy shoes from off thy feet, for the place whereon thou standest *is* holy ground." (Exodus 3:5b) Priests did not go to war with 'flesh & blood,' as did the other tribes—they had a different war (Ephesians 6:12)—protecting God's Tabernacle on earth (1 Corinthians 3:16).

God desires a kingdom of **priests** and a holy nation. Exodus 19:6, Deuteronomy 7:6, Isaiah 61:6, 1 Peter 2:5, & Revelation 1:6.

In John 20:21-23 Jesus breathed on his disciples and made them priests but told them to wait for more power (Luke 24:9).

for Glory & Beauty (Exodus 28:2 & Job 40:10)

Duties of a Priest

- 1) be identifiable by your holy apparel
- 2) make atonement offerings for sin
 - 3) oversee purification ceremonies
 - 4) enlighten & teach God's Truth
 - 5) be a servant in God's house
 - 6) offer holy worship to God
 - 7) condemn wickedness

The last of these duties is addressed by God in Job 40:14, when, instead of sympathizing with Job, he exhorts him to **DO SOMETHING about the evil that has befallen him.**

Like Esther, he is given the opportunity to overcome.

Job 40:10-14

"Deck (clothe) thyself now with majesty and excellency; and array thyself with

Glory & Beauty.

Cast abroad the rage of thy wrath: and behold every one that is proud, and abase him. Look on every one that is proud, and bring him low; and tread down the wicked in their place. Hide them in the dust together; and bind their faces in secret. Then will I (GOD) also confess unto thee that:

HAND can save thee."
